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## March 2017 Walnut Report

March 2017 shipments were 56,106 inshell equivalent tons. This is a record for the month of March and exceeds March 2016 by 12,581 tons (+29%).

## 2016 Walnut Supply (inshell tons)

- Inshell shipments were 14.2 million pounds for the month of March, an increase of 4 million pounds (+46%) compared to March of 2016.
- Season to date inshell shipments are 381.1 million pounds through March, an increase of 103 million pounds (+37%) compared to the same period last season.
- Shelled shipments were 45.9 million pounds for the month of March, an increase of 7 million pounds (+20%) compared to March of 2016.
- Season to date shelled shipments are 295.2 million pounds through March, an increase of 50 million pounds (+21%) compared to the same period last season.





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March 2017 walnut shipments from California added to the strong shipment trend we've seen over the past 24 months. Total shipments of 59,198 inshell tons was the second largest March and is in line with the prior two seasons. Season to date shipments of 525,986 inshell tons have the industry on pace to ship the entire 2016 crop with little carryout.

Most California growers are sold out for the season. Existing inventory is mostly committed and offers are almost non-existent. Buyers who are short are scrambling to find product while those with inventory are happily taking profits.

Harvest in Chile is well under way and all reports so far are positive in terms of volume and quality. Business has been solid for new crop from Chile with some growers reporting to already be fully committed for inshell allocations. The shelled market started a bit slower but has now picked up speed as buyers are not able to access supply from other origins.

March 2017 shipments were up versus March 2016 in most major markets:

- North America was down -7% for shelled and down -41% for inshell for the month of March. With season to date shelled shipments up 17% over prior year (+15 million pounds), the overall trend remains positive. Buyers in the USA and Canada continue pulling from existing inventory at a steady rate and are busy covering any forecasted supply shortages before new crop is available.
- <u>Europe</u> was up 32% for shelled and down -44% for inshell for the month of March. For shelled, shipments to Germany drove the increase up 66% (+2.6 million pounds) while most other markets were fairly flat with last season. Season to date shipments are up 22% for shelled and 34% for inshell with nearly all markets showing good growth over prior year.
- Middle East / Africa was up 70% (+1.7 million pounds) for shelled and up 58% (+1.9 million pounds) for inshell for the month of March. Increased shelled shipments were driven by Israel, Saudi Arabia and the U.A.E. Increased inshell shipments were driven by Turkey and the U.A.E. Season to date shipments to this region are up 29% for shelled and up 57% for inshell. Most major markets showed good growth with Turkey leading the way (inshell shipments of 116 million pounds so far this season).
- Asia / Pacific Rim was up 46% for shelled and up 186% for inshell for the month of March. Higher shelled shipments were driven by Australia (+61%), China (+252%), Japan (+41%) and Korea (+9%) and Taiwan (+91%). Stronger inshell shipments were driven by India (+1,237%) and Vietnam (+118%). Season to date shipments to this region are up 29% for shelled and up 22% for inshell. Japan, Korea and Hong Kong have seen the biggest increases in shelled shipments while shipments of inshell to India have shown strong growth, being up 289% (+22 million pounds) over the prior season.

New business activity has been steady for Chilean origin walnuts. There is little new business taking place for California origin walnuts due to limited supply. Bloom is under way for the 2017 California walnut crop but it's much too early to know anything. Expectations are for a small carryout heading into the new crop which should turn into good demand and a stable market.
